

## CREATING A ROAD MAP

### Downloadable pages for James Berlyn's Loungeroom Project tutorial

James's tutorial explores four basic questions with accompanying brainstorm activities for each question. The questions in this tutorial are designed to assist project participants with the development of their own artistic 'road map' which they can employ and refer to as they create their original short work for The Loungeroom Project. You don't have to download these pages. You can create your own or just make notes on your computer or your phone. Whatever suits you best!

The four questions explored in the tutorial are:

James's Brainstorm rules:

- Select a time length for the brainstorm activity and use a watch or stopwatch function on your phone to measure it.
- Prepare some blank sheets of paper / a new document on your computer or a new voice memo on your phone or voice recorder.
- Give yourself some thinking time before you attempt to brainstorm each question in the tutorial.
- Once you start the brainstorm, write/type/speak continuously as you attempt to capture all your thoughts regarding to the provocation question that you are brainstorming.
- If you run out of responses or don't know how to answer the question, simply write/type/ or say, "I don't know the answer" and continue to repeat writing/typing/speaking that until your next thought, idea or image arrives in your mind.
- It is not important to write in full sentences, just short phrases or individual words is enough. By the time you have written them, your next thought on the subject will already have arrived. Full sentences will just slow you down and you may miss some valuable ideas!
